Channels of Glory – Letter from Dr. Simon Zachariah

We are on the fourteenth year since we started this organization. When I think about it, I can see many faithful donors who believed in our mission and supported us generously. But I also have seen many young children, who were helpless fourteen years ago, now have grown bigger, educated, and holding respectable positions in society. I thank God for all the faithful donors who supported these less fortunate people. This reminds me of a narrative written by Thomas Alva Edison about his younger days. One day Thomas Edison came home and gave a paper to his mother. He told her, “My teacher gave this paper to me and told me to only give it to you.” His mother’s eyes were tearful as she read the letter out loud to her child: “Your son is a genius. This school is too small for him and doesn’t have enough good teachers for training him. Please teach him yourself.” Many, many years after Edison’s mother died and he was now one of the greatest inventors of the century, Edison discovered something while he was looking through old family things. Suddenly he saw a folded paper in the

corner of a drawer in a desk. He took it and opened it up. On the paper was written: “Your son is addled (confused). We won’t let him come to school anymore.” Edison cried for hours and then he wrote in his diary: “Thomas Alva Edison was an addled child that, raised by a hero mother, became the genius of the century.”

In order to understand things and people differently, you have to have a special love and tolerance in you towards them.
